ENTRY FEES

INDIVIDUAL (adults)

18 years and above: £2.00 per entry.

SCHOOLS/JUNIOR

For a group of less than 20 entries a fee of 60p per entry applies.

For a group of 20 to 50 entries a fee of £10.00 applies, with 60p for each additional entry thereafter.

** Individual junior entries (if still at school) £1.00 per entry.

*** Please note that the deadline for school entries is **Friday 21st October 2022**.

SENIOR COMPETITORS FROM OUTSIDE GUERNSEY

Entries are accepted from outside the Bailiwick if the entrant has a connection with the Island or is a Jersey resident. Each entry should be listed on a separate entry form and sent with the fee (cheques made payable to Guernsey Eisteddfod Society) to the Secretary by **Saturday 28th January 2023**. Please add sufficient postage for return of entries.

EXHIBITION ENTRIES - HANDING IN AND COLLECTION

School entries must be posted or delivered to the Secretary at the above address by **Friday 21st October 2022**.

Senior entries should be sent to the Secretary by **Saturday 28th January 2023**.

Alternatively they can be handed in at The Grammar School, Social Area 7, Les Varendes, St Andrew's on **Saturday 28th January 2023** between 10am and 12.30pm.

RETURN OF ENTRIES

Senior entries should be accompanied by a stamped addressed A4 envelope or appropriate postage should be paid at the time of entry. All entries will be returned during the week after the exhibition closes. School entries, together with any certificates awarded, will be returned to the schools by the Executive Officer.

SECTION REGULATIONS

SENIOR

- 1 Preferably entries should be typewritten and must use only one side of the paper. The competitor's name must not be shown. No work which has already been published for gain may be submitted. All other work is eligible.

JUNIOR/STUDENT (Teachers Please Note)

- 1 Poetry or prose may be submitted. There is a limit of two prose entries and two poetry entries per pupil. The prose entries should NOT exceed 1000 words, poetry should NOT exceed 50 lines - please make sure this rule is adhered to. Failure in this respect can result in the entry being disqualified.
- 2 Entries must have been written during the previous academic year - September 2020 to July 2021. The pupil's school must NOT be shown and there should be absolutely no comments or marks by teachers on the manuscript.
- 3 The Eisteddfod Class Number and the School Number MUST be shown on the front or back of the paper, with the title of the piece and the entrant's name. Failure in this respect results in a lot of extra work for the adjudicators and can result in the piece and any certificates not being returned to the appropriate school.

ADJUDICATION

No marks are given. Trophies and Certificates are awarded at the discretion of the Adjudicators.

- 424 **POETRY TO A TRADITIONAL FORM** (ballade, villanelle, sestina, sonnet, rondeau, pantoum, cinquain, etc), **up to 60** lines.
- 425 **HUMOROUS VERSE or PARODY**, **up to 60** lines.
- 426 **LIMERICK**, **3** to a page.
- 427 **HAIKU**, **3** to a page.
- 428 **OPEN POETRY**, free verse or own choice rhyme scheme, **up to 60** lines.
- 429 **STORY FOR CHILDREN**, **up to 2000** words (please specify the **age range** you have in mind).
- 430 **TRAVEL**, **up to 2000** words.
- 431 **SHORT STORY**, **up to 2000** words.
- 432 **LOCAL WRITING, PROSE** related to life in the Bailiwick **up to 2000** words.
- 433 **DRAMA: SCRIPTED PIECE OR MONOLOGUE**, **up to 2000** words (**not** including naming of characters and stage directions).
- 434 **OPEN PROSE**, essays, personal anecdotes, reminiscences and other entries which do not fit any other prose class, **up to 2000** words.
- 435 **HUMOROUS PROSE**, **up to 2000** words.
- 436 **FLASH FICTION**, short stories **up to 400** words.

PLEASE NOTE

Please do not exceed the word or line limit. Any manuscript that does exceed these limits runs the risk of being disqualified.
